FROM DIRECTOR

Entire Vikas Sansthan team is happy in publishing the Annual Progress Report for the year ending 31st March 2020. It is published as well as placed in public domain on our website. Every year our organization reaches new landmarks in achievements in almost all activities. The reporting year was also full of such achievements. Our outreach was to the extent of 1000 households with substantial overlapping of households. Our largest activities are around elimination of child labour and bonded labour from Glass / Bangle, Carpet and Brick Kiln Industry.

This reporting year, VIKAS SANSTHAN has made direct difference in lives of some 1000 families with 1174 children and 200 adolescents. Through our livelihood promotional programme we have touched the lives of more than 296 mothers of freed child labour and reached them through 29 SHGs. The SHGs, Federation and Jeevandhara Mutual Benefit Pvt Ltd have played important role in linking families of freed child labour with income generation activities. This year, our team responded to a total of 400 children in need of protection and support and conducted several outreach activities to generate awareness among the communities about child rights, education rights, gender equity, social taboos / stigma as well as negative consequences of working children into glass / bangle, brick and carpet industry. This year, the team with the support of leaders of CBOs / collectives also ensured increased level of access over government schemes / programmes and services in favour of eligible child labour families.

Now Our direction of child labour elimination campaign is very clear to achieve the target . The children is eliminating from the slavery through our many rehabilitation approaches . So we hope and sure that we will touch the moment very soon when we will take long inhaling for the total elimination

of child labour from the carpet and glass and bangle and brick kiln industry and we will short out the problem of poverty in the area.

Thank a lot to our colleagues and team workers and volunteers of the society for too much laboring for reaching the goal and targets and special thanks to our community who is believing to us for getting the achievement and solving the problems of the children. And very special thanks to our lovely donors and funders who are really great because we will not get anything without their support and help. They are big part of our achievement.

Section 1 About the organization

VIKAS SANSTHAN started its intervention since 1993 with the support of local communities' members. Vikas Sansthan is not for profit, secular and non-political organization registered under the Societies Registration Act (1860) with the Foreign Contribution (Regulation) Act. The organization is receiving funds from the national and international funding agencies for its child and bonded labour elimination programmes centered around child rights, education, vocational skill training, communities collectives, gender equity, women empowerment and livelihood promotional activities. Different support helped children to get a chance at a better education through NFE as well as ensured that freed child labour get access to formal school.

The organization intervention area is highly child prone areas. The project areas of the organization is presented extended across 02 districts Firozabad and Agra covering 13 slum areas and 5 Brick kiln industries and 2 villages of carpet industries. The organization is presented reached among approx 1000 families. Over the years, Vikas Sansthan has developed a community collective called Mahila Avam Baal Adikar Bachao Abhiyan across its operational areas that led to eliminate child labour and enhance the role of mother / parent of freed child labour in protection & safeguarding of child rights. We are also working and exploring that how we can make our Baal Panchayat, Child Rights Protection Committee, Adolescent Groups and SHGs / Federation more sustaining over the long term. Vikas Sansthan has been led by Founder Director Shri Dilip Sevarthi, who has lifelong commitment towards urban and rural poor especially for children, adolescents, women and vulnerable groups. The organization has acquired very high reputation for performance, integrity and transparency towards elimination of child labour.

Vikas Sansthan's main objectives are to improve the living conditions of poor & marginal communities' members especially child labour and bonded labours in its operational areas.

Vision, Mission and Values

We envision "a society free from exploitation, where the people, especially women and children are not discriminated on the basis of their sex, caste, creed and religion."

Viewing the vision from a broader angle our mission is "to strive for a society where the poor and marginalized, disadvantaged sections can progress towards socio-economic development by reducing poverty through eradication and rehabilitation of Child Labour, empowerment of women, and empowerment of health care and educational opportunities of the community."

To us, development is a process of empowerment. We do not believe in service – delivery. Rather, we follow a rights – based mode which tries to empower people to manage their development themselves. Therefore, "a strong belief in the essential dignity of the people and in their ability to tackle the forces than can crush or exploit them" is the value on which all our interventions are based.

Although we started with organizing rallies, staging large gatherings and demonstrations, campaigning, etc. for raising awareness and highlighting the issue at the higher levels and continued it.

Rational for working in FIROZABAD and AGRA districts of Uttar Pradesh

- 6 slums of Azad nagar area and 6 Slums of Ramgarah area and one slum of habib Ganj of glass and bangles of Firozabad city and 2 villages(kankar and Pura Surajmal) of carpet belt of Agra distt and 100 children sponcered of Firozabad distt and 05 locations of project areas – Nagaji, Jaishankar, P.M, Shyamlaji & Gurudeo Brick Kiln field of Pinnahat, Agra
- child labour and bonded labour prone zone
- poor living conditions lack of water facilities, unhygienic living condition
- high incidences of migration in search of livelihood in slum areas from surrounding rural villages
- absence of schooling among children especially girls' / marginalized children

In the face of these daunting challenges, Vikas Sansthan belief that children especially child and bonded labour are the most affected groups. Children could be most effective purveyors of information and the best agent of change.

- Rehabilitate freed child labour through education opportunities and vocational skill training courses for youth above 15 years old

Section 5 Details of Interventions of the organization

5.1 Child Rights and participation

The organization has continued its intervention in this reporting year to



increase child participation under the leadership of Baal Panchayat and equip the children with information to

transform. More than 1140 freed children across the operational areas joined into 17 NFE center and continuing their studied. More than 1140 freed children across the operational areas joined 17 Baal Panchayat and inspired to get involved and taken action through their Baal Panchayat. During the process which included training, monthly meeting, continuous interactions and discussion with project team members / NFE Instructor & other stakeholders throughout the community, this Baal Panchayat have matured, racked up significant achievements and earned the respect of their parents and larger communities. On the individual level, too, a dramatic change is visible in children, their behavior and how they perceive themselves and their role in the community as well as elimination of child labour, protection & safeguarding of child rights and addressing gender inequality. The children have found a new voice and stepped forward to play an active role in the community and work to make it better. Governance and government authority have improved as the children brought children and parent together to understand and address their collective problems. And this empowerment did not stop at hygiene and sanitation but the children have taken the initiative to prevent child marriages, help drop-outs go back to school, tackled issues of exploitation and gender discrimination, and become vocal advocates for the elimination of child labour.

5.2 Non Formal Education Centre

VIKAS SANSTHAN believes that every child has the potential to shine; given chance. The organization has been running NFE centre for providing learning



to freed child labour, which is a preparatory, supplementary and an excellent alternative to formal schooling for all children. Non-formal

education refers to education that occurs outside the formal school system. Non-formal education is often used interchangeably with terms such as community education, lifelong education and second-chance education. In view of large number of out of school children and un- served habitations, concerted efforts have been made by the organization in its operational areas in the form of non-formal education. Despite all around improvement in school education, there is a significant number of out of school, never enrolled and dropped out children in the areas. Observing this reality the organization is running NFE centres, which has been conceptualized as an organized educational activity for the freed child labour. The organization look at the emotional, physical, social and psychological growth of the child and create programs, learning modules and knowledge building sessions to aid the process of overall child development. It was observed that post studying in NFE Centre, children were more confident, able and empowered in their communication within their homes and formal schools later. Some children have also been instrumental in bringing about relevant change in their home and school environments, taking responsibility for themselves as well as their peers

5.3 Community Based Organizations (CBOs)

Without the active involvement and engagement of the community,



especially village leaders, it is impossible to achieve the program objectives. Many government schemes fail for lack of community participation. This is a major reason behind poorly functioning of government services / programmes. Therefore, since inception Vikas Sansthan

has conceptualized the structure of community based organization. Over the years, the organization has mobilized the children, adolescents, parents and mothers of freed child labour and involved them into their collectives which are...

- for Children Baal Panchayat
- for children health club
- for adolescents Adolescent groups
- For parents / communities Child Rights Protection Committee
- for mother of freed child labour SHGs / Federation / Jeevandhara
 Mutual Benefit Nidhi Ltd .

The project staff has had regular interactions with all community based organizations to engage the respective members / leaders in the goals of organization initiative. The monthly planned meetings were well attended by the members of these collectives. These meetings with the CBOs have also assisted in the roll-out of the action plan of the organization.

5.3.A. BAAL PANCHAYAT (Children parliament)

B

BAAL PANCHAYAT has been formed in due course of the project intervention

and it is marching ahead with the collective strength of 1140 members of 17 Baal Panchayat in the operational areas of the organization. The members have learned about the issues of child labour, bonded labour, the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child, child participation, sanitation and hygiene, gender equity and other child related issues. Children Parliament played striking roles in taking up the agenda of Child Labour and Children Rights more effectively in this reporting period.

5.3.B. Health Club

Health Club has been formed in the organizational operational areas to



address Health & hygiene issues. Over the period, total of 06 health clubs has been formed with 172 members in Misereor supported area. Health Club is creating awareness about negative

consequences on health among children / adolescents working in glass, bangle & brick kiln industry. It also encouraging parents for regular check up of children in government hospitals.



5.3. C . Adolescent Groups

The project team members facilitated in formation of adolescent groups in



the project areas. The purpose of formation of adolescent groups was to mobilize adolescents towards health & BOUR IN INDIA –VIKAS SANSTHAN India

gender mainstreaming agenda as well as ensure education. The project facilitated Adolescents Forum has been playing striking roles in taking up the agenda of Child Labour and Children Rights more effectively in the project

areas.

This forum is effectively taking up the agenda of gender discrimination & exploitation and health issues of adolescents. Total of 399 members associated with 15 Adolescents Groups



5.3. D . Child Rights Protection Committee

The project team members mobilized the parents of child labour and



organized them into CRPC. The project team members has facilitated community level processes and mobiloize parents of child labour & freed child labour for their association into collective called Child Rights Protection Committees. Child rights protection

committee is a social structure. It was formed for safeguarding & protection of the rights of the children. They keep vigil on the incidences of the child labourers. They always make an endeavour to evade the incidences of child labourers in their respective areas. They work for the empowerment and development of the children. CRPC will play important roles in taking up the agenda of Child Labour and Children Rights more effectively. Total of 17 CRPC are functional with 189 members.

5.4 Capacity Building for communities' leaders & the project staff / volunteers

5.4.A Communities' leaders / members

The members / leaders of CBOs have little knowledge of or skills for working



for elimination of child rights and safeguarding & protection of child rights. This hampers the effectiveness of the project interventions especially the childhood education services through NFE, livelihood promotion through SHGs / federation, promotion of gender equity.

Therefore the organization has provided range of training for the leaders / members of CBOs during the reporting period. Before the Vikas Sansthan intervention, the communities were completely unaware of the concept of child rights. But after the organizations' capacity building programme, leaders / members of different CBOs become aware about the concept of child rights, negative consequences of child labour, education rights, provisions of government services / programmes, etc.

The facilitators and the children used the pictorial booklet on child rights to explain and discuss the topic in details. Through these training programmes,

the members / leaders of CBOs learned various activities and games for developing cognitive, affective and psychomotor skills of children. The organization also worked on showing them how to use local material to develop Teaching-Learning Materials (TLM) using local items during NFE instructor training on teaching methodology.

5.4. B. Project Staffs and Community Level Volunteers

The project staff and community level facilitator including NFE instructor



shoulders the responsibility ensurina planning and effective implementation of the programmes. It is imperative for them to have sound understanding of the project, objectives, strategies, expected outcomes and issues level

understanding such as child rights, education rights, gender equity, concept of SHGs, teaching methodology, functionality of CBOs, etc. The participants explored practical ways of transferring this knowledge to their community and came up with innovative delivery models.

5.5. Women empowerment & livelihood promotion

The project team members mobilized the mothers of freed child labour and



organized them into SHGs. The purpose was to do regular saving & credit and linked them with income generating activities. The project was instrumental in mobilizing 296 mothers in linking with SHGs. It is expected that SHGs will also

contribute in elimination of child labour and seeking support & solidarity towards protection & safeguarding of child rights in the project areas. For the strengthening of the self-help groups the project has started conducting their meetings. Mothers attend the meeting every week and raises and discuss the issues such as economic, political, social, empowerment, gender discrimination and their livelihoods. In weekly meeting they deposit their savings and they assess the progress made by the self-help groups. They put various problems before the members, discuss with each other and also try to resolve them. Through the self-help groups, women put their problem. By doing complaints, women received the benefits of different government programmes and social security schemes. Women get information through the self-help groups. Women also discussed the health issues. They have the freedom to put the health issues in the groups meetings and they discuss and resolve the health issues themselves. All this has increased the awareness on health issues. The mothers of freed child labourers are now accessing the loan from the groups and setting up their livelihoods. Not only they are developing themselves but also their families are developing. Women together have decided that any woman who does not have any ration card, they will help them to get the ration cards. They also make every one aware on the government schemes.

5.6 Child Labour rehabilitation through Vocational Skill Training

 Total of 110 youth / adolescent received orientation on importance of vocational skill training courses on tailoring & stitching, Mobile Repairing, Beauty and Carpentry for self & job employability of the project areas



5.7. Essential Services and Entitlements

Vikas Sansthan is working towards ensuring increase level of access over essential services and entitlements in favour of eligible individual / families with focus on child labour and their families. CBOs are coming forward towards plascing the demand with concern authorities in organized and planned ways. During the reporting years total of 677 individuals / families benefited from essential services and entitlements.

Section 6 . Key Events during reporting year 2019-2020



School Chalo Abhiyan (School Joining Campaign) - Vikas Sansthan has organized *School Chalo Abhiyaan* from 30 Nov to 06 Dec 2019 in the project areas. The campaign has covered Hasmatnagar, Abbas Nagar,

Satya Nagar, Samrat Nagar, Kaushalya Nagar and Ganga Nagar slum of the project areas. Total of 433 participants witnessed the campaign and provided their support & solidarity for the enrollment of children especially freed child labour & girls' children in government school. The campaign was organized for ensuring education rights of the children in the age groups of 6 to 14 years.

Baal Sansad

Baal Sansad was organized on 14th September 2019 at Vikas Ashram, Rupasnagar,



Shikhohabad. Total of 27 child leader participants attended the programme. Mr. Dilip Sevarthi, Project Director and Narendra Singh, Project Coordinator moderated the session. Member of Baal Panchayat namely Kumari Jyoti, Kumari Kanchan, Muskan, Ashish, Shubaan, Aarif, Sabia and Shimbhu Dayal actively participated during the programme. The children mainly from Hasmat Nagar areas have attended the programme.

The purpose of the programme was to educate children about child rights and negative consequences of child labour. The other purpose was to prepare children for asserting their rights & entitlements as well as creating aware about health & hygiene issues. The focus of the programme was to link freed child labour with education. The objective was to reduce incidences of child labour by providing information about minimum wages.



SHGs Mahila Sangam

Day long SHGs Mahila Sangam was held on 18 September 2019 at Vikas Ashram,



Rupaspur, Shikohabad, Firozabad. Total of 60 women leaders of the SHGs participants attended the programme. Mr. Dilip Sevarthi, Project Director, Narendra Singh, Project Coordinator and Premvir Dev moderated and facilitated the meeting. Participants from Hasmat Nagar and other 5 slum

Section 7 Conclusion

The 2019-20 year has been inspirational, as we reached among more numbers of child labour families and freed approx 1174 children from glass / bangle, brick and carpet industry in totality. We have achieved a level of maturity and capacity that positions us well to execute child rights and livelihood promotional programme at large scale.

The response of the community in the operational areas was challenging but we have been able to mobilize them on child rights agenda and reaffirmed the power of our child-driven model. The services in the program area have developed into lively , vibrant centres that are finally providing all the services to the community that they were created for them . We viewed our CBOs as an opportunity to encourage self-sufficiency in the community. While pursuing our traditional funding avenues, we are also looking at more funding as a new source of institutional support. Our recognition on child rights issues will ease the way for both conventional and new forms of funding as it validates the organization both professionally and financially. remittance of funds continues to be an area of concern. But we are working towards fund mobilization in the coming year.

As we move forward more confidently in the coming year, we are grateful to all our partners and supporters and look forward to a year filled with achievement and progress.


